Curriculum

Rich opportunities to achieve academic excellence

At Kassim Darwish Grammar School, we offer a broad and ambitious curriculum designed to encourage intellectual curiosity, a passion for learning and the development of essential study skills. It includes core subjects, such as English, Mathematics, Science and Physical Education, alongside compulsory faith-based subjects, such as Religious Studies, Qur'an and Islamic Studies in years 7, 8 and 9 or Living Islam in years 10 and 11. These are complimented by a wide range of Humanities subjects, including History, Geography, Business Studies and Citizenship, Modern Foreign Languages such as Arabic, Spanish and Urdu, as well as technical subjects including Art and Computer Science.

Our curriculum encourages pupils to reflect on their own values and beliefs, develop confidence in them and to show respect and understanding towards those with different perspectives. Central to this is the ability to embrace diversity, manage emotions effectively and to communicate constructively across various situations. This is further supported by our comprehensive PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education) programme, through which pupils cultivate positive physical and emotional wellbeing, and the skills needed to navigate both in the immediate and wider world.

The learning experiences at our school are designed to build their confidence, resilience and self-esteem, equipping pupils to make informed choices and take personal responsibility for their learning and choices.
